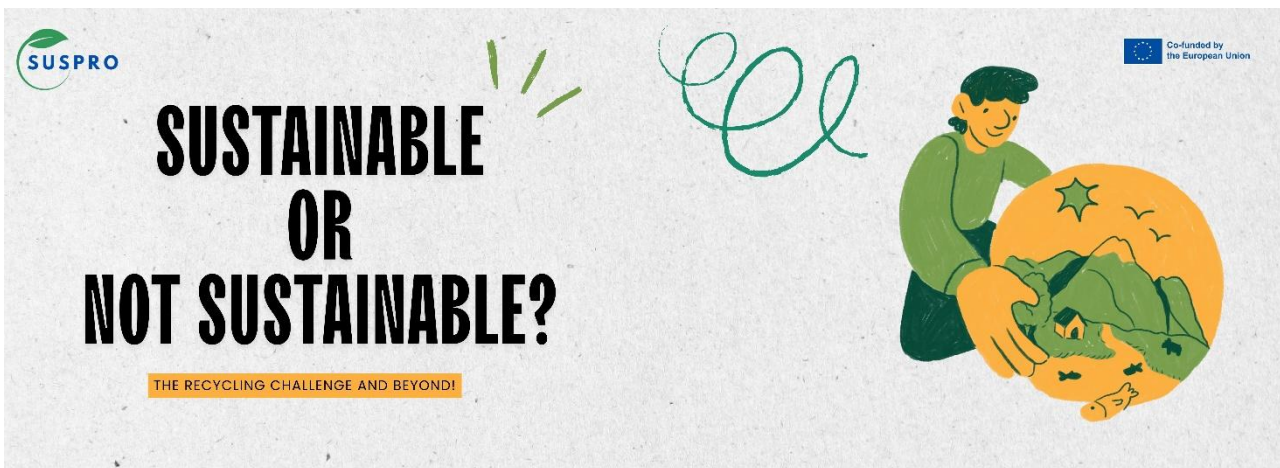




QUIZ QUESTIONS

Question 1:
